

CARTER'S FALSEHOODS



On Sept 29, 2004, supposedly during a "meticulously observed" cease-fire, Dorit Benis, 2, and Yuval Abebeh, 4, were killed by a Kassam rocket fired from Gaza into the Israeli town of Sderot. Hamas claimed responsibility for the attack.

CARTER

Pg. 179: Hamas ..., for sixteen months [since August 2004], had meticulously observed a cease-fire commitment, which they called hudna.

FACT

August 31, 2004 Two Hamas bus bombings in Be'er Sheva kill 16.

September 29, 2004 Hamas rocket kills two toddlers.

January 13, 2005 Hamas attack on the Karni crossing between Gaza and Israel killed six civilians

July 14, 2005 Hamas rocket kills Israeli woman.



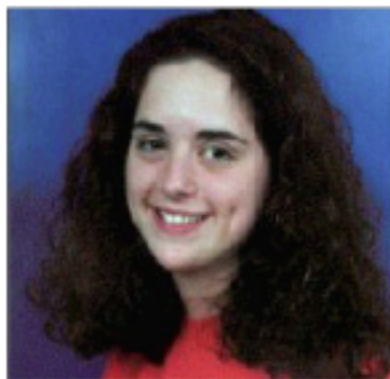
Hamas leaders still today vow never to recognize Israel. Carter ignores these assertions, and has even denied specific statements attributed to Hamas's Ismail Haniyeh (pictured above).

CARTER

Pg. 62: When I met with Yasir Arafat in 1990, he stated, "The PLO has never advocated the annihilation of Israel."

FACT

The PLO's founding charter contains multiple demands for the elimination of Israel, and Arafat himself frequently called for destroying that nation, as in: "Peace for us means the destruction of Israel. We are preparing for an all-out war, a war which will last for generations." (February 1980)



Throughout the book, Carter downplays terrorism against Israel, such as the April 1995 attack that killed Brandeis student Alisa Flatow.

CARTER

During a Dec. 12, 2006, radio interview, Carter insisted the head of Hamas did not say, "We will never recognize the usurper Zionist government and we will continue our jihad-like movement until the liberation of Jerusalem."

FACT

The Associated Press, Chicago Tribune and many others confirm that Hamas's Ismail Haniyeh did indeed say that.

CARTER

Pg. 190: The governments of Ariel Sharon and Ehud Olmert have built the fence and wall entirely within Palestinian territory...

FACT

United Nations figures confirm that the barrier adheres to the "green line"—the armistice line marking the boundaries of the West Bank—along about 45% of the green line's path. Moreover, in some places it veers into Israeli territory. The remaining portions are in disputed—not "Palestinian"—territory.

CARTER

Pg. 125: An Israeli "withdrawal to the 1967 border" of the West Bank is "promised in the Camp David Accords."

FACT

The Camp David Accords, which were signed by Carter himself, state: "The negotiations [concerning the West Bank and Gaza] will resolve, among other matters, the location of the boundaries..."
